I was recently reminded of the linguistic roots of the word "church." In the New Testament, the word that we read as church usually comes from the Greek word $ekkl\bar{e}sia$ (ἐκκλησία). This word, in turn, comes from a compound of two other words: ek (ἐκ) – a prepositional word, usually denoting a place of origin (i.e "from"), and kaléō (καλέω) – which means "to call." So, literally, church means "called from."

In the narrowest understanding, this means we are called from our individual homes to meet together as a gathered assembly (for worship and other shared work), and this is an important part of the experience of being church. The defining importance of gathering together is why we are all grieving so much the loss of our usual patterns of gathering on Sunday morning. But, to be the people who are "called from" can mean so much more than just gathering in one place.

- It can mean that we are *called from* whatever other ways we are spending our time in order to share a time of dedicated worship.
- It can mean that we are *called from* our individual-focused lives into a sense of shared mission and identity.
- It can mean that we are *called from* the concerns, worries, or pursuits that distract us from God's way, into the new life we have in Christ.
- It can even mean that we are *called from* our worship (where we receive) *to* our work of service in the world (where we give to others what has been given to us).

All of these understandings of what it means to be "ecclesia" reinforce that church describes not a place but a shared identity. Church is something we ARE, not a place that we GO.

And that means that we can still BE church even when we are scattered. We don't have to be in the same place physically in order to share the same identity and calling. We can do the work to which we are called wherever we are.

This time of COVID and physical distancing, of the loss of our shared space and the uncertainty about how to be church in changed circumstances, has me thinking of the early Jerusalem church following the martyrdom of Stephen (Acts 8:1b-3). That, too, was a time when the church was scattered. Believers who had all been gathered together in Jerusalem spread out across the Jewish world and even beyond. And this was how the message spread! God used a time of trauma that must have felt like the death of the early church and turned it into a time of mission. As a result of this scattering, Phillip shared the message of Jesus with the first African convert. As a result of the scattering, the apostles recognized new believers in Samaria (where Jews has always been at enmity). As a result of the scattering, Saul travelled to Damascus, and on that trip encountered Jesus and became the apostle Paul. The early believers might have thought they were just running away from persecution, but really they were *called from*. The church GREW because it was scattered.

And all of that makes me wonder: How might the scattering of our church during COVID lead to new growth?

Plans for Re-Gathering

Sept. 13 – our extra-special ELCA Rally Day – is drawing near, and with it the long hoped-for opportunity to again gather for in-person worship. Many volunteers and worship planners have been working hard to get our sanctuary set and protective policies in place.

One of our protective policies is limiting the number of people in the building, which means taking reservations. We will be using Eventbrite to manage RSVP so that you can be sure that your space is reserved and have all the information you need to attend. Here is how it will work:

- The Sunday BEFORE our in-person worship, a link will be sent to the full congregation with the information for how to register for attendance at the 10:00am or 12:00pm service. (Note – people filling assistant roles will already have spots "reserved")
- Click on the link for the service you wish to attend (you will need to provide your e-mail address).
- If there is space available, you will receive a confirmation message and a follow-up e-mail with safety information.
- If there is no space available, you will be placed on the waiting list. If a spot opens up, you will receive an e-mail inviting you to register to attend.
- If you do not have a chance to attend the service of your choice the first month (i.e. you are on the waiting list), you will have priority opportunity to register the following month.

That covers the first kind of "reservations," but we are very aware there might be other kinds as well. If you are hesitant to join our in-person worship, please know that you will not be forgotten. We will continue to livestream our 10:00am worship every week, whether or not there are worshipers in the sanctuary. You are just as much a part of our worshiping community as anyone who is physically present. And If you have "reservations" about the safety protocols, we are more than willing to hear them and to talk them over with you. We know that masks can be uncomfortable and stifling, that it is hard to imagine worship without congregational singing, and that our plans for worship feel really different than we are used to. We are seeking to be guided by science and best practices, and we want to share the reasoning and intention behind all our decisions. If you have any question, or other "reservations," please know that you can bring them to Pastor Serena, Ben, members of Council, or our Worship & Music chair, Mary.

Then we will continue by following the Hebrews when they return home hundreds of years later and must re-establish their worship life. How will their experience compare with our new version of worship life during and after the COVID-19 pandemic? I'm hoping for some lively conversations!!
