On the first Sunday of November, we celebrate the feast of All Saints. This tradition began with two separate days (three if you count All Hallow's Eve – Halloween – which is now a purely cultural celebration). All Saints Day, on Nov 1, was for remembering and honoring recognized Saints of the church, folks like Mary Magdalene, Francis of Assisi, and Oscar Romero. This celebration was followed by All Souls Day, on November 2, to remember the lives of all the departed. In other words – one day for the "special" Christians and another day for everyone else.

I am grateful the Lutheran church has abandoned the distinction. It's bad theology. There are no "special" Christians. One of the core teachings of Martin Luther about the Christian church is that we are ALL "both sinners and saints." There is no rank ordering of people in God's kingdom, no judging of some of the faithful "better" or "worse" than others.

This is good news! Because it means that our value is not conditional. We don't have to worry that we could do something bad that would make us become unworthy in God's eyes. God already knows that we are all sinners – that we fail to be the people God has created and called us to be in a hundred different ways – and God has said an unqualified "yes" to us anyhow! So, it's a waste of time (and a distraction of our energy and attention) to compare ourselves to others, whether that comparison makes us feel good or bad. We all fall short, but we all get forgiven.

That's the other side of the equation: that we are also all saints! Just like Saint Francis, and Mary Magdalene, and Archbishop Romero. Our lives may not look much like their's, but in the eyes of God we are not a lower level of believers. God has called us all saints!

This understanding of sainthood is important for our understanding of our own identities, and it is also important for the griefs that we bring to All Saint's Day. When we lift up the names of our departed in prayer, and when we light candles in their memories, we can remember them as the sinners and saints that they are. We can bring the fullness and the complexity of our griefs into our worship. We can grieve the beauty and the love we have lost, and also grieve the things that were imperfect in our relationships. And, even as we grieve, we can rejoice that the promise to all of God's saints is that we will be united again.

Growing up in the Midwest I attended Lutheran schools during my entire childhood - in fact through college. My course work always included theology classes and I was taught the most traditional Lutheran Church - Missouri Synod interpretations of the Bible, at least through high school. My King James Version was annotated with historical years in which Genesis 1 was dated B. C. 4004.

I don't continue to subscribe to every Biblical interpretation and point of view that I was taught in those years. For example, I now recognize that female pastors are not only permitted, but are a blessing from God! But one of the practices I learned that I have appreciated throughout my life is that of tithing. Having been encouraged to give 10% of one's income back toward God's work, as God's people were asked to do in the Old Testament, it became a habit of mine from the time I started earning money.

When Mary Beth and I married, while she didn't grow up with this same habit, she understood it and readily agreed to adopt this practice as well. I'll confess that we figure our tithe after taxes and medical expenses (and after retirement savings which we'll tithe when we receive in retirement). Also, we consider charitable giving as well as what we give to Abiding Peace to be part of our tithe.

The money that we give away is a reminder to us that everything we have is from God. It helps us to be more grateful and thankful for it, while knowing that we are supporting the work of our church and other important ministries.

We believe that we are blessed through it. As God has promised in Malachi 3:10: "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this... and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." I cannot say that such blessings are necessarily always

material things, but certainly we have been blessed abundantly in many different ways, and through good times and tough times, have always had enough.

I can understand how difficult the practice of tithing can be for many people. At Abiding Peace we encourage people to consider the challenge to "grow one percent" a year, as is explained in the mailing with the pledge card that you are receiving. Please remember to bring your pledge for 2020 to church on Sunday, November 24.

If you are not tithing or moving in that direction, test it out. See if God will not throw open the floodgates and pour out blessings that overflow! Discover the difference that generosity makes in your life and in your faith.

### Building New Spiritual Practices— The Art of Prayer

Did you know that you can pray without words? When we pray in worship it generally means either words or silence (or singing – singing can be prayer too). But prayer can be practiced in ways that tap into other parts of our minds and bodies, and these practices can be really helpful, especially for folks who struggle to focus in personal prayer. Art can be a really powerful way to connect with God, and not just for super artistic people. Anyone with paper and a few colored pens or pencils can color as an act of prayer. Seriously!

"Praying in Color" is a book and website (www.prayingincolor.com) by the Macbeths, Sybil (a dancer and former teacher) & Andy (an episcopal priest), which teaches a creative way to focus mind and body on prayer in an innovative way: by using pen and paper not for journaling, but for doodling! Not random doodling, of course. The practice of praying in color uses the physical discipline of intentional doodles to focus the mind on what we want to pray about. It could be a person we want to pray for, or an attribute of God we want to contemplate, or a personal growth goal that we want God's help to cultivate. Whatever our prayer need, doodling the prayer helps our mind to explore the prayer in company with God while our bodies join in the attention too.

If you are having a hard time imagining what this might look like, here's a picture of a prayer doodle I made this week.

Clearly, you don't need great artistic talent to engage in this spiritual practice. And I have been amazed how much easier it is to keep my mind engaged in prayer when my hands are



guiding the conversation! I encourage you to check out the website (<a href="www.prayingincolor.com">www.prayingincolor.com</a>) and give it a try. We'll also have a chance to explore praying in color at our first ever Abiding Peace Advent Retreat following worship on Dec. 1!
