Claim the Next 500

At the 2017 New Jersey Synod Assembly in early May, the front of the hall was hung with two banners depicting the church doors from Wittenberg (where Martin Luther posted his famous 95 Theses) and the slogan "Claim the

Next 500."

This slogan is more than a commemoration of the 500th Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation that forever changed the Christian church; it is a proclamation of the church's identity and mission. As Lutherans, our identity is that of the reforming church. Our heritage is a story of seeking to follow wherever God is leading God's people, even when that means disrupting familiar ways of doing things. As Christians, our mission is to proclaim the gospel of God's love and grace and to serve our neighbor. We are called in order to be sent. We don't stand still.

"Claim the Next 500" is a call to action that challenges us to look and listen for where God might be leading us next. We can celebrate our history and remember what God has done in the church over the last 500 years, but if we only focus on the past we miss participating in God's work here and into the future. Abiding Peace, along with the whole ELCA, is facing challenges and unknowns. Claiming the next 500 might mean embracing changes to the ways we are used to doing things. But our history of Reformation teaches us how exciting those changes can be, when they focus on bringing the gospel of God's love and grace to the world. So, are you ready to claim the next 500 together?

From the Council President

The heat is on – summer is here. A number of our members will be taking vacations and will be away on weekends. I wish all travelers a safe and rewarding trip. For me, I prefer to travel in the fall and winter. I do maintain Abiding Peace as a priority whether I am at our service or not. I know I have mentioned it before, but I would like to encourage members to make automatic contributions to Abiding Peace. I set up a weekly payment to Abiding Peace through my checking account at my bank. That way, my support of abiding peace is there even if I am not.

One of the reasons I mention this is we are facing a number of expensive repairs to our building. At our last council meeting we prioritized the needed repairs. Our first priority will be replacing our furnace (while it is warm outside). This will cost in the neighborhood of \$12,000 to \$13,000. We feel we can just about cover this cost. The air conditioner for the narthex needs a new compressor which may cost around \$4,000. Considering the cost of the furnace repair, we cannot make a commitment to this at this time. Last of the needed repairs is the roof over the sanctuary. This has the highest price tag, but lowest priority because we only occasionally have a problem with this issue.

I encourage all to keep up with their regular giving, and, if possible, give a little extra. Remember, Abiding Peace is always here for you.

Evangelism/Outreach

The following is from my temple talk on May 7, regarding our Evangelism ministry at Abiding Peace Lutheran Church.

I had been ask to give a temple talk regarding our Evangelism ministry at APLC. I have been exceptionally blessed with a family who has been involved serving our Lord. I had a grandmother who spent over 40 years as pianist/organist at St. John's in Brandonville, PA. My grandfather spent over 40 years on the Parish Council most of them as president.

My first involvement in evangelism was accompanying my grandmother on visitations to our inactive members. I was in my teens.

When Carol Lee and I moved to Brooklyn, NY, we were actually evangelized by my aunt and her family. They simply invited us to attend worship service with them. We became members and I became active in congregational matters: Sunday school, financial secretary, treasurer and council member.

When we moved to Netcong, NJ we were evangelized by my cousin and her family. They invited us to attend worship service with them at a new Lutheran congregation meeting at the school building: APLC. They were all charter members

Once again I immediately got involved. I was ask to serve as financial secretary which I accepted. As a CPA obviously my talents were in finance. I also got involved in our stewardship ministry and building program.

Our congregation was in need of someone to head up our evangelism ministry and I accepted. The first few years I attended the Synod's workshops on evangelism. Then we became very fortunate when Pastor Linderman began a 2 year study on "Word and Witness."

Most of us have a favorite scripture verse. John 3:16 for God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him shall have everlasting live.

Evangelism follows Matthew 28:16-20: The Great Commission. Go to all people everywhere and make them my disciples: baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit and teach them to obey everything I have commanded you. And I will be with you to the end of the age.

We have just celebrated the Easter season: Christ is Risen, He is risen indeed: the Resurrection. I have two additional verses which are among my favorites:

- ~ Jesus said, I am the Way, the Truth and the Life.
- ~ I am the resurrection and the Life

Since Carol Lee has passed on I look forward to my own passing on. To be in the presence of God and reunited with Carol Lee where together we can sing God's praises throughout all eternity.

While in the past our evangelism ministry has included door to door visitation, like my own experiences the most effective is one on one. Many of you will notice I wear Carol Lee's cross almost every time I'm in public; it is a conversation starter. I have had many occasions where someone will ask about the cross I am wearing; another is a daily attempt to get someone to return my smile.

Let me conclude by asking you to – Go. Invite someone to worship with you; offer to bring them.
