In July, my family and I spent a week on the beach in North Carolina. I have always loved the ocean, but it had been several years since I last had the chance to sit on the shore and learn again the lessons of the ocean waves. Ocean waves offer a sensory experience of one of the deep paradoxes of faith: the way it is both consistent AND ever-changing.

The rhythm of the crashing-ebbing waves is one of the things that I most love about time spent on the shore. It seems to seep into my subconscious like a subtle lullaby, rocking me into a souldeep sense of peace. In and out. Rush and retreat. The waves never cease this alternating movement, and this predictability of rhythm soothes me. It is as untouched by the great events of history as it is by my son's enthusiastic efforts to defy the onrushing tides. Nothing can stop the rhythm of the waves.

But the rhythm of the waves is not unvaried. It changes with the tides and winds. Sometimes it pounds the beach, and sometimes it caresses. Sometimes it is a gentle ripple that barely has the energy to form a white crest around my knees as I wade, and sometimes it swells and crashes over my head, or lifts me to rush up the sand on its back. There is joy and beauty in each variation, but I cannot order up the variation that I want in any given moment. I have to take what comes and find the way to appreciate the waves that meet me.

This constancy with variation is a good metaphor for the life of faith. There is a reliable certainty about the God who's *steadfast love never ceases*. The One who set the rhythm of the waves is ever-present in our lives like the lullaby of waves on the shore. But, like that sound of waves, this presence can get so familiar we forget to notice it is there, until the tides of life change. When the waters of life get a bit rougher, we often become more aware of God's presence, because we also become more aware of our need – our smallness and fragility before the vastness of life's ocean. That awareness can be a hidden blessing of the storm, because it reminds us of what has always been there: God's deep, abiding love for us.

Our Mid-Year Financial Challenge



In the first half of 2018 our congregation's income was nearly as much as our expenses. However our income has not nearly matched our mid-year budget. Our budget reflects our real expenses for 2018, factoring in the increase starting in September when, God willing, we have a Pastor. A \$5,400 gap between our income and our budget so far this year needs to be closed.

The Church Council hopes to extend a Pastoral Call to Vicar Serena very soon! We can only do this if we know we will have the financial resources. It is an urgent challenge to which we believe we can rise. Our congregation has met worse obstacles in the past, and by God's grace we shall do what we must to address this need.

Whether you pledge or not, please prayerfully consider your giving to Abiding Peace, and whether you might increase it.
