When I first answered the call to Abiding Peace I did not quite know how it was going to work to be a "commuting pastor," living about an hour's drive away from the congregation. Now, 2 ½ years into our ministry together, I can confidently say it's working well. I use my hours in the car to listen to books or podcasts that nourish my soul; Lay leaders in the church continue to lead many ministries well, with no need of my interference; I am able to stay connected with church members through phone, text, and e-mail on days I am not in town. Most importantly, we love each other, and a little distance does not interfere with that.

But I am conscious of one challenge: I don't have the chance to participate in many town activities outside of the church, because I don't live here. In a very literal, geographical sense... I am not a neighbor to the larger Mt. Olive community. In a logistical sense, distance is a barrier.

I have been reflecting on that challenge in the context of the recent Justice Gathering of the Lutheran Episcopal Advocacy Ministry. The theme for this year's Gathering was "Who Is My Neighbor?" The Gathering provided speakers, workshops, and worship to guide us in reflecting on people and groups that we might not automatically think of when we imagine who our neighbors are: people struggling with addiction, and people who have been incarcerated, and people experiencing homelessness, and people seeking asylum, to name a few. These are groups of people whose life experiences put them at a real distance from me... and because of that it can be hard to know how to be neighbors.

### **Hospitality in Food Handling**

You may have noticed the new signs in the kitchen and buffet areas asking everyone to be conscious of safe food handling procedures. One of the wonderful things about this congregation is how much we eat together. Sharing meals or nibbles is part of what creates the sense of family that we share. And just like in our families, we sometimes need reminders to make sure that we are not sharing our germs along with our conversation and care. Please keep these guidelines in mind as you prepare and handle food together:

- Always wash your hands before preparing or setting out food for church events.
- Always use serving utensils to serve food. (In the case of finger food – for example, carrots or bunches of grapes – touch only the food you are picking up.)
- If you are handling food (such as slicing bread), use a napkin to hold the food, rather than touching it directly with your hands.

You never know when the story you share about how your life has been touched by God's Spirit and God's people might be exactly what someone else needs to hear to find hope, or to finally step through the doors of the church. After all, we are part of the *Evangelical* Lutheran Church in America. Let's share the good news that our lives are better when we find God in community.
