At our annual meeting on Jan. 27 our congregation stepped out in faith and unanimously passed a budget that we know is a “stretch.” It sets a benchmark for spending about \$10,000 above what we received in 2018, and unlike in prior years there’s almost no wiggle room in this budget to adjust down.

This was a decision we made with deliberation, and with faith... and maybe with a bit of fear and trembling. I know that I, for one, tend to be pretty risk averse. So, the idea of a “stretch budget” makes me a little anxious. And my natural reaction when I feel anxious is to tense up, to contract, to hold everything tight. But I’ve been reflecting on the idea of “stretching” even when my instinct is tensing.

Part of my weekly routine for health, and strength, and spiritual grounding is to practice yoga. I appreciate the chance to center myself in my body and in prayer at the same time – experiencing the reminder that God is present with me as close as my breath. Stretching is an essential part of yoga. In many poses, especially poses where I am reaching out, away from my comfort zone, I have to stretch to be able to hold the pose. And that act of stretching is actually what makes me stronger. If I tense up, if I retract, then I can’t hold my balance. But when I stretch, trusting that the work I have done has prepared me to reach, I find a strength I didn’t know I had.

My hope and prayer is that our congregation will find new strength and balance in the stretch. That as we reach farther than we have reached in recent years, that we will be able to push away the instincts telling us to contract. That we will find balance in our grounding in the gospel, and that we will reach boldly in pursuit of our mission, trusting in the strength God is building in us.

As part of our Lenten focus on *transformation* this year, Abiding Peace will be participating in a 4-part Bible study for local congregations called **Congregations**

for Justice. This study, hosted by Trinity Lutheran Church in Dover, will explore the teachings of scripture that call followers of Christ into efforts to *proclaim good news to the poor and set the oppressed free*, with a particular focus on issues of hunger in our state.

SOMEWHAT OFFICIAL RULES FOR A CHILI COOK-OFF

1) SELECTION OF THE JUDGES

Proper judges for any Chili Cook-off should have three principal values:

- a) A complete lack of values or principles, such as integrity. No one with integrity would even attend a Chili Cook-off, let alone judge one. Sales ability counts for extra points if you can sell Spam as real food.
- b) A bribability or sleaze factor, such that judging could be listed on the IRS form under "occupation". Check for questionable occupational ties such as contractor, financial planner, or health care professional.
- c) Taste buds that have visible scar tissue. No one who can even spell "filet de boeuf marchan d'vin", or knows what it is, could hope to qualify.

2) QUALITIES THAT DETERMINE A WINNING CHILI

Chili should be made with:

- a) Absence of any form of vegetable matter. Chili is a meat dish, an entrée. It is NOT a casserole. Corn and beans should be an instant disqualification. Selected peppers are permitted only if ground to a size small enough to escape visual detection.
- b) Density or viscosity. The serving spoon, when placed vertically into the chili pot, should remain erect without help. Chili placed onto a cracker remains there and doesn't trickle down your sleeve. When you water down chili, it is no longer chili. It is soup. Soup is for Wednesdays in Lent.
- c) Applicable "after_____" words. *Afterburn*, such that after a spoonful, it doesn't really matter whether or not they removed your tonsils as a child. *Afterglow*, animals and small children stand next to you outside 'cause you're very warm, all over. Other "after—" words that could be applied include *afterlife*, *aftertaste*, and *aftermath*. Do not try to use *afterburner*—this is a church event!
- d) Fear. The fear that if you burp, you will melt fillings, crowns, and do serious damage to nasal passages.

My Story

The car made that last right turn one Sunday morning...

First and foremost please understand that this was not an easy task for me to accomplish as I find it difficult to open up and talk about my personal faith. This time, however it is different.

Let me put the car in reverse and back up a little bit. For several years I have stayed away from church. I still believed, prayed occasionally and even read the Bible from time to time. Despite having been raised Roman Catholic, a leader in a fraternal religious organization and having served the parish in various ministries and capacities, I continued to stray far away anyway. Embarking on a new endeavor in my life, that being working with children as a teacher, coupled with the Catholic church putting on blinders for all those years with the child abuse, I found myself needing to find a new home as I couldn't go back to where I was before... or maybe I just didn't want to go back there. Either way, the time seemed to grow geometrically and I saw myself moving further away and never did anything about it.

As a teacher I'm always preparing lesson plans, teaching kids how to conduct research as well as assess situations that prepare them for life. Needless to say I didn't need to script out a lesson but it was something I needed to research. I needed to see if there was something that aligned with my faith and that might help me regain what I let go. Sometimes the internet is not the nicest place to be; however it is also at times a beautiful thing and an endless source of information. I started looking and digging, trying to find where I was hoping that God would guide me to. I ran a Google search on Mt. Olive churches and immediately came across the website for Abiding Peace Church. I did some drilling and found that there were links to the weekly sermons; so I said to myself read one and see. Over the next few days I found myself straying away from setting the lineup for my fantasy football team, looking at the news, going on Facebook or even just playing a game that I had downloaded and reading these words instead. Some if it made sense, some didn't but I did what I tell my students...dig deeper...and I did.

Also on the website there's a link to a video that I will call the infomercial that really isn't an infomercial. It was an invitation and warm welcome by Pastor Serena! But more so, it showed people coming together in faith...all with ear-to-ear smiles that beamed a warm welcome.

Finally, one thing that always caught my eye was the sign on Route 46. There are always little quotes and blurbs that continually pique my curiosity. The one that caught my eye the most was the one that asked if I wanted to learn more about Martin Luther... Being a social studies teacher and with the Reformation as being part of this year's curriculum, I wanted to come in and hear all about it. So that Sunday I got in my car drove over in that direction, turned right off of Route 46 and slowly came up the road. For some reason, however, my car didn't want to turn into the parking lot and I kept going up the street to the top of the hill. I took a different route home. Something inside told me to go back and read another few sermons so I did.

The following week I had some real estate business that I was doing not too far from the church. I left early and drove down Route 46. I made the right hand turn and again I headed up the street wanting to see if the car would turn in to the parking lot. That week again my wheels stayed straight and I drove by the turn again.

I gave some thought about calling during the week and seeing if there was somebody there I might be able to talk to. But this time my phone didn't want to dial so I sat back and wondered just what was going on. Later, I looked at the website and that week's sermon still had not yet been posted.

That night there was a ballgame on TV that really didn't interest me so I grabbed the laptop and went right to the website. I randomly selected a sermon off the list because that week's still had not been uploaded to the website, and to be honest I don't remember which one it was. I said to myself, I'll get in my car one more time this Sunday and see if I go down Route 46 and make a right hand turn and if I come up the hill and see if my Toyota will make that last right turn. I then realized that it wasn't the car that didn't want to turn in there, it was me. I wasn't ready. I wasn't sure if I'd be doing the right thing after 58 years of being a member of another church. Am I going against how I was raised, my parochial education? I thought a little more and said to myself you haven't done anything in almost 3 years, duh...

Sunday came around and I jumped in my car, headed down Route 46 and made a right hand turn up the hill and pulled into the parking lot... Major step! This time not only was I in the parking lot but I found myself getting out of my car and walking towards the door...Major step two. As I got closer I got this strange feeling in my heart... not that it's racing but rather a calm peaceful feeling. As I approached the door, it opened and there was a kind man standing there who said, "welcome we're so glad you're here." And as he shook my hand he said, "let me show you where everything is so you feel at home." It was the first time in a long time or maybe ever, that I had felt that way in a church.

Then without having to take two steps I was further welcomed by everybody who was around. I'm horrible with names (still trying to remember all 143 of my students names) sometimes, and I was a bit overwhelmed but everyone said the same thing: welcome! Then I was greeted with the most warming and genuine smile from Pastor Serena who said "Welcome, I am so glad you can join us."

I sat towards the back during the service not because I didn't know anybody but I needed a little bit of time to process all that was going on, and to be perfectly honest if necessary, sneak out without drawing too much attention. When it came time for the sign of peace I was amazed. During the sign of peace in the Catholic mass you pretty much shake hands with your neighbors within an arm length and never really go far from there. I was amazed as I watched everybody get up and move around and everybody wish each other peace. I really did not have to move too far as everyone seemed to go out of their way to come welcome me.

After the service as everybody shared some extra time together over a cup of coffee and some snacks. I had the opportunity to talk to a few people, most importantly Pastor Serena. I asked her if it would be okay to come and sit down and talk with her as I wanted to learn more. But in my mind it wasn't necessarily to know more. I was scared of what was happening after just an hour and a half of being there. Pastor Serena invited me to come by on Wednesday when she was in her office.

Wednesday came around and when I made the right turn into the parking lot I was the only car. Pastor Serena had mentioned that she had another engagement and might be a few minutes late. As she got out of her car she said, "I'm so glad you waited," and as she unlocked the church door that feeling once again came over me...I felt welcomed. I told her I was confused and afraid as to what I was feeling. We sat and talked (more me than her) for a long time, no sermon or lecture just two people talking and praying. I asked her questions looking for answers but rather than providing the answer she kept encouraging me to open my heart and mind and let my faith in God lead the way as I sorted it out. When I walked out, a lot of the confusion still existed but most of my concerns and fears were alleviated. Sensing that I would be returning, Pastor Serena said "I'll see you Sunday and I hope you can stay and join us in reading the Gospel of Luke." I didn't interpret it as a mandate on her part but rather as another way of her letting me know I was welcomed.

As part of my vetting process, my original intent was to visit other local Christian churches to see what they're all about. Being a teacher I put together an organized alphabetized list and first was...well needless to say my search ended quickly with the letter "A."

So it comes down to this. My white Toyota had nothing to do with me pulling into the parking lot. The car is just where I sat. But on that Sunday I now believe it was God's gift of the Holy Spirit that was behind the wheel and driving, guiding my car into the parking lot, then taking my hand and walking with me through the door where the embrace of this welcoming congregation took over.

As a teacher I found I hated Sunday because it meant the weekend was just about over. Now I can't wait for Sunday to come around so that I can get in my car, come down Rt. 46, make a right turn and come up the hill and then make that final right turn...and come to this special place where I feel welcomed.

I can't thank everyone enough for quickly making this stranger a welcomed friend; it means so much to me. I ask that you not only keep me in your prayers as I try to sort all this out, please also pray for those who are close to making that one last right turn into one of God's parking lots.
