I have to admit it, I was a little nervous as I stood to open our congregational dialogue on political disagreements at the end of February. It could be so easy for a conversation about how we disagree to go sideways. I have heard that the Vicar year in the ELCA ordination process is about giving pastors-in-training the chance to make their mistakes in a congregation that does not have to live with them long-term. But my situation is a bit different, and I don't want to learn my lessons at the expense of this community I have come to love.

I am so grateful that fear did not stop us from talking, and that we trusted God to lead us in practicing the kind of community that doesn't run away from hard conversations. We shared our stories, and our frustrations. We affirmed the complexity of the experiences and perspectives that bring us each to our political opinions. Most importantly, we made commitments to each other based on the promises of God to form us into Christ's body, in all our diversity and unity. With the support of Council, we will be posting the affirmations and commitments we formed in that conversation in a prominent place in the church building, as a reminder of how to keep talking.

Because that conversation was just a starting place. We need to keep talking. We need to keep rejecting fear in favor of love. We need to keep listening to each other's stories and sharing our own. We need to keep working together to try to discern how God is calling us to engage the issues of our day in a way that starts from our faith, and that recognize our most fundamental identity is as baptized children of God.

The Dreaded "S" Word

It is Easter time. We celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who died for us and at the same time, taking on our sins and shortcomings so that we are free of these when our time comes to meet our Lord in person. Jesus is the steward of our transgressions, making us free of them.

How should we respond to this?

Stewardship is not just money. For me, I believe we should respond to what Christ has done for us by being good stewards of all that our Lord has given to us. The earth we live on. We need to preserve it as best we can. We should recycle what we can, not only paper, cans, bottles, and cardboard as required by most municipalities, but with items we no longer use. We have cloths we do not use, there are household items we do not use, but these items could have usefulness to others. There are non-profit agencies that can collect these items and use them to help others who are not as fortunate as we are. Let's break the disposable society we live in and reduce what we put in our landfills and at the same time helping others.

giving by one per-cent (1%) a year of our uncommitted receipts until we reach the tithing point (10%). This year (2017), our approved budget reached the nine per-cent (9%) mark. We are being stewards for the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. We, as members, do need to keep in mind that Abiding Peace does have bills and salaries to pay to keep our doors open.
