




New Dancer Welcomed

Date: April 12, 2016

Gathering - We come together for worship

Council observed Corporate Confession (ELW p.238 left side) followed by Sharing of the Peace and the Lord's Supper.

The work of the people - previous

- **1.** The February and March minutes were reviewed and accepted as they are.
- 2. Reports:
 - **a. Pastor's report:** Pastor Carol Peterson in Mendham will fill in for Pastor Karol while she is away from 4/16 to 4/23. Please let Pastor know if you or another member of APLC is in the hospital. Pastor Karol met with Paul and Leah St. Genis to prepare for Holy Communion. Pastor showed us the drawings the children made and explained their meaning. She recommends them to receive First Communion on 4/24 with the Bishop.
 - **b. Finance Report:** Giving and Spending were about equal in March. We had some plumbing and heating issues during the month of March which are not resolved yet Council was talking about maybe getting an instant electric water heater.
 - c. Social Ministry: Faith Kitchen going well with servings more than 150 servings a month all year.

The food pantry is still serving around 10 people/families a month and we were running low on food. We went shopping using some of the money we have for this purpose and there is still food in the yellow room that needs to be sorted.

We want to do a Thrivent Action event "Fill the Freezer" with the intend to purchase a new stand-up freezer, hopefully with the help of Lowe's or another store that would be willing to make a donation to our church. They cost around \$500 and up.

We have applied for Thrivent Action money to have a Dance at Mount Olive Manor Senior housing on May 12th from 6 to 8:30pm. We have someone doing the music and the money from Thrivent will pay for him. We hope for members from APLC to also attend and bring some appetizers to share. We will invite Pastor Linderman and his wife Dorothy and Bruce Kleindienst from Thrivent.

d. Worship and Music: We discussed the Easter Vigil Tradition that started after Christ's death and went all night until Sunrise. There is a need of power point volunteers. Gerry said he would look into the possible ways to have a rail on the wall behind the altar for people to hold on while going up the stairs.
