Sometimes...it causes me to tremble.

I am writing this article the week after Holy Week... my first Holy Week with this community and my first Holy Week in a pastoral role.

People outside of Abiding Peace keep asking me how it went, and I keep finding it hard to put the enormity of this experience into words. I am tired, of course, but I am also invigorated. I am moved by the commitment and engagement I observed in this community, and I am also making notes to remember the things I hope we can add or adjust next year. I am doing my mental debrief to try to maximize my learning, but I also find myself catching my breath at how beautiful and transformative it was to experience this story again/for the first time with you all. I am conscious that this week (and the exhaustion that comes with it) might not be the most objective perspective from which to evaluate our Holy Week celebrations, but I am also aware that this slight sense of dizziness is part of what it is to experience transcendence.

In short, I feel like I am living inside the *sometimes* of the Good Friday Hymn, "Were you there." As we sang together to the familiar, aching melody: "Oh, oh, oh, oh, sometimes it causes me to tremble, tremble, tremble." I have always loved that line, because it gives room for both the transcendent and the mundane moments of faith. The trembling is real – it has been real for me this week – but it is not always. It is sometimes.

Easter can be an awe-filled trembling moment in the life of the church, and I am grateful for that. It can be a moment when we are captured anew by the nearness of God hanging on a tree and by the power of the empty tomb. I want to celebrate the transformative truth of the moments when we tremble together...

But I also want to guard against the let-down that can come after the trembling. Not every week is Holy Week. Not every Sunday will see us bringing in extra chairs to make sure there are enough seats, and not every service will feature an altar spilling over with flowers. And that's OK. Sometimes we get to tremble at the power and the beauty of our faith. Sometimes our gathering will feel much more plodding and familiar. But ALWAYS the Crucified and Risen Lord calls us to be the church – called into the world to serve, and love, and witness. Thanks be to God.
