### **Confession as Reformation**

In reflecting on the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Reformation, a pastor colleague recently posed the question "what is one thing you want for our *Future Reforming Church*." There are a lot of good things to hope for the church as we continue the never-ending process of reformation. My particular hope is that the Lutheran church become a more *confessional* church. By *confessional* I don't mean that we reinstitute the practice of individual confession. I don't want confession as a religious duty. I want confession as an approach to living out our faith.

Too often Christian faith gets confused with an exterior righteousness which separates us from each other, because we think our lives must look holy if we want to be part of the club. *Confessional living* rejects those expectations and tells the truth about our need for grace – every day!

Lutheran liturgy almost always begins with confession and forgiveness. The starting point of our worship is that we have not earned this chance to worship, and learn, and receive Christ's body and blood. We are there despite our mess-ups, because God forgives and welcomes us. What would it look like if this pattern of worship was reflected in our relationships? Rachel Held Evans, has suggested that "you are not a real church until you know one another's go-to sins." What if we felt free to confess our struggles, and our mistakes, and even our "sins" to each other, and to then remind each other of, and practice together, the grace we receive from God?


