#### We have a Vicar!

The council finalized the paperwork for Serena Rice to be our Vicar. Her first Sunday with us as Vicar will be September 11<sup>th</sup>. She is planning to have her first day in the office on September 7<sup>th</sup>

Remember, this is a part time position. Serena will generally be with us on in Budd Lake on Sunday and one other day (usually Wednesday) during the week. In addition to that, she will be working from home for a half day each week and will be on call for any emergencies or special needs. She will also be taking courses at Philadelphia Seminary part time. She will be under the supervision of Pastor Karol Van Wulfen (who has been our Vice Pastor for the past 3 years). And remember, it is our job to support Serena as well. She will be there for us and we need to be there for her. We will learn from each other. Have any questions or concerns? Contact me. If I do not know the answer, I will attempt to get the answer.

This is a ground breaking situation that we are beginning. I do not know of this process being tried in the ELCA congregation before. It is my opinion that Abiding Peace can be successful with this process and be a model for the ELCA congregations to follow in the future. There is a definite need for pastors in the ELCA and a lot of congregations cannot afford a full time pastor. As I mentioned last month, we had an elected member of council resign due to a change in work requirements (not being able to attend our meetings). I urge you to consider being a member of your Church Council. We usually meet the third Tuesday of the month. Want to see what we do? Feel free to come to our next meeting and observe what we do. Our meetings are open to all.

#### Message from Vicar Serena

This month marks the start of my partnership in the ministry of Abiding Peace as Vicar. Together we are embarking into somewhat uncharted territory, which will require trust and learning on both sides. This could be a source of some anxiety, but I believe it is also an important part of God's gift to us. I see that gift in at least three qualities of this partnership.

- 1. It helps us to really live into the *priesthood of all believers (1 Pet. 2:5)*. As a student Vicar, I come to this congregation knowing that I will depend on your history as a strong teaching congregation. My hope is that this need and inexperience on my part can be a blessing for you, reinforcing and strengthening the knowledge and gifts you all bring to our collective ministry. All the baptized are part of a *holy priesthood*, and I believe our mutual learning emphasizes the vital role of all members of our community in the work God has given us.
- 2. It creates a healthy expectation of imperfection (2 Cor. 12:9). As we learn together in this work, it is inevitable that we will make some mistakes. That is part of the learning process. With that expectation, we can be prepared to look for the lessons God has for us in the missteps. Some of Jesus' most powerful sermons came in response to the mistakes of his disciples (e.g. Mark 9). As we learn by trial and error, I expect God will have some great lessons for us, and God's power will be made perfect in our weakness.
- 3. It reminds us that *Christ is the true head of the church (Col. 1:18)*. I know God has called me to leadership in ministry, and I deeply value the trust of this congregation in calling me to serve as your Vicar, but I also know I am just a vessel. I do not have all the skills, knowledge, and wisdom this church needs. As a community, we must continually seek the guidance of Christ's Spirit, as our source, our goal, and our light on the path.

If we are stepping into uncharted territory, it means a journey of discovery. I am truly excited to discover and serve together with you. To the glory of God. Amen.

#### **Message from the Vice Pastor**

This is not goodbye.

And yet it is the end of my time as your Vice Pastor. After three years of working with your church council, joining you for worship for the annual congregational meeting, and visiting some of you in the hospital or my office, I am happy to see your new opportunity for pastoral care and leadership.
