In seminary they teach us that Advent is an "eschatological" season, a season where the church focuses on the already/not yet reality of the Christian faith. Professor O. Wesley Allen, Jr. uses a metaphor to explain what this means. Imagine that you are driving on a two-lane country road at night. As a cautious driver, you may turn on your brights and maybe edge toward the center of the road for safety. But suppose that you are driving up a hill and you notice the glow of the headlights from an oncoming car. You cannot see the car itself yet, but you will still lower your high beams and make sure to move back into your own lane. Your behavior has changed "already" even though the other car is "not yet" fully revealed.

Our advent theme of **Active Waiting** will explore this idea that our behavior is changed by our expectations about what we do not yet see. Throughout the season we will be looking at ways that we are called to stay active even as we know that we have to wait for the fulfillment of God's plan for the world. Our Advent waiting is not passive. We do not know how long we will wait for the fulfillment of God's plan, but the expectation that God intends to save the whole world from sin and death changes how we experience the time of waiting. We know that what we do with our lives is part of what God is doing with the world.

During our mid-week services we will reflect on the stories of three biblical characters who had to wait. Joseph will teach us about *working* during seven years of waiting (Gen. 29:15-20). The Prophetess Anna will teach us about *worshipping* during a lifetime of waiting (Luke 2: 36-38). And Mary will teach us about *witnessing* as she waited for the arrival of Jesus (Luke 1:46-55). *Working, Worshipping*, and *Witnessing*. That is the invitation of an Advent of Active Waiting.
