Have you ever thought about how you would tell your faith story? Often, we think about faith as a matter of theology – what do we believe about God? Or maybe we think of faith in ethical terms – how does my faith guide my behavior and decisions? But the way we experience our faith is not usually as a series of truth statements or ethical principles. Our faith is bound up with our stories – how has God showed up in our lives to comfort us, teach us, and challenge us? This is the power of our witness, and this is why our faith really matters to us: because it shapes the experiences of our lives.

Our fall stewardship focus we will be talking about *the power of sacred story*. We may hear the term "sacred story" and think that means stories in the Bible, or stories of saints, or stories of God showing up in powerful ways in the history of the church. And it does. But those powerful ways that God shows up include the ways that God shows up in each of our lives. Each of our lives is a sacred story, because God is active in our lives. Taking the time to pay attention and think about the sacredness of our own stories can help us to recognize that activity, and to let it shape us.

Throughout the month of November we will be hearing from story-tellers in our congregation about the sacred stories that speak to the power of generosity in our congregation. These stories will be opportunities for you to hear and to recognize the sacredness of the everyday stories, to be touched and inspired by the way God is actively working in and through our church. They will also be opportunities for you to ponder your own sacred story. God is active in your life – sometime in obvious ways, and sometimes in ways that require a little more attention to

Mark's is the shortest of the Gospels, which gives us an opportunity to explore a new way of hearing the Word in our community. Following worship on November 26, we will gather to share lunch and the Word. As a community, we will read through the entire gospel of Mark in one sitting!!!

If you have never done this before, it is a transformative way to experience the story of Jesus and his disciples. We usually just hear the gospel in little pieces – individual scenes. And we can forget that those scenes make up one big story. Hearing them together as a single story, in the way they were written, changes how we hear each of the individual scenes.

So, put November 26 on your calendar. Bring your appetite for the Gospel (and sub sandwiches), and let's experience this transformative story together!
