Thirsty Ears

At the inaugural meeting our new Visiting Outreach Ministry (see the *Would you like a visit?* blurb) I learned a wonderful phrase from one of the members: "thirsty ears."

I could not love this idea more. It is a two-word picture of the listening required for genuine relationships. Relationships thrive on the longing to really know each other, to attend to each other's stories with the eagerness of a thirsty traveler drinking a cold glass of water (or beer, if that's your fancy). There are few things in this world that can make us feel more valued than a pair of *thirsty ears* attending to what we have to share about ourselves.

In our information-overload culture this kind of attention is so rare, but it doesn't have to be. Scripture teaches us that we are Christ's body, sent to do God's work in the world. We often talk about how we are God's hands, but we are also God's ears. When we use our ears to really listen to each other, and to all the people in our lives, we can communicate God's love without words. Such listening takes practice, and I know I need that practice at least as much as any of you (since it's often my job to talk). Shall we practice together this Summer? I would love to hear your stories, and I believe that we will grow as a community when we all make a point of seeking the privilege of drinking in each other's words... maybe over a tall glass of water (or a cold beer).

Would You Like a Visit?

Abiding Peace has a new ministry team! Four of our lay members (Nancy Ayotte, Thom Coates, Cindy Pawlo & Alexis Sweeney) are working with Vicar Serena to develop a new visiting outreach, with the hope of expanding our church's capacity to visit the sick and respond to pastoral care needs in the congregation. At minimum, this team grows our ability to bring communion to members who are sick or hospitalized during the week, but it is also about building relationships. Every member of our community is missed when they are away, and this is one way to bring church to you when you aren't well enough to make it on Sunday. But it only works if we know who might appreciate a visit. So – please – call the church office or Vicar Serena if you are ill, or injured, or just need a listening ear and a reminder that Christ body and blood are given for you!



Mind the Gap

The phrase "mind the gap" comes from London's underground system. It's a phrase that repeats over the load speaker at the tube stops to remind the riders leaving the train to *pay attention*, so as to avoid catching their feet in the small gap between the train and the platform. It's an important reminder, because in the midst of rushing through life even a small gap can send you sprawling if you aren't paying attention.

Abiding Peace is facing a "small gap" in our budget. About halfway through the year, our expenses have exceeded our giving by a little under \$3,700. It's not a gaping hole, and we have a little funding in reserve so all our bills are getting paid, but it's the kind of gap that could send us sprawling if we don't pay attention. As we work as a congregation to grow our ministry and live into the work God has given this community to do, our financial stewardship empowers that work. There is no need to panic. God is faithful, and God is clearly working through Abiding Peace. As we move forward in that mission, we just need to "mind the gap."

The chart above reflects giving and spending for all budgeted items. Designated (pass through) giving and spending is not included.


Justice Gathering September 16
